FROM THE DESK OF THE SECRETARY

Brethren, by the time you receive your December edition of The Wadsworth Sideliner you will have received the 2010 dues notice. Please remit your dues on or before December 9, 2009. Remember that your dues are the life blood of our Lodge. When you send in your check, please up-date your address, phone number and internet address for our Secretary.

In the By-laws of Wadsworth Lodge revised November 2000, Article V, Section 1 states The Annual Lodge Dues shall be \$37.50 plus \$30.00 for Grand Lodge dues, payable in advance by the first Stated Communication in December of each year. Members reaching 75 years of age or 50 years of membership shall be granted Life Membership whereupon exemption is granted from Wadsworth Lodge dues, but the Brother is still obligated to pay Grand Lodge dues of \$30.00. If there is a hardship for which a brother is unable to pay his dues, Article VI, 1b states "Should reasonable cause be established because of poor health or financial problems the member may have his due remitted by vote of the Lodge." Please, brethren, let the Worshipful Master or Secretary know of your hardship instead of becoming unaffiliated for nonpayment of dues. Your lodge is required to pay the Grand Lodge dues as long as you are carried on books.

TALE OF THE RING

Tale of the Ring From Bro. Latson Andrews, October, 2009

One good thing about computer, their handwriting is better than mine. It was about 57 years ago that my father-in-law raised me at Wadsworth 417. A day I will never forget and the certificate on the wall of my den will attest to that. I was born in Newburgh on July 1, 1926. Enough about me.

About 8 years ago we were driving from Connecticut to Illinois. A few miles west of Charlston, West Virginia I hit a tire carcass in the road. Our car died on the spot. A member of the Courtesy Patrol stopped to help me. This is a patrol designed to help people like us out of trouble. The man's name was Gary Holbert. He remarked that he liked the ring that I was wearing. He never mentioned it again.

Gary arranged for our car to be brought to a garage for repair- broken fuel pump. The garage owner - Hubie Hatfield - had his wife arrange a motel for us and brought us to the motel. Next morning she picked us up about 8:00 and returned us to the garage. We were on our way shortly.

I can't prove it, but the way we were treated must have meant that both men were very familiar with my ring. Another example of kindness and brotherhood extended to a stranger. That is what it is all about.

DISTRICT NEWS
